The exercise, which is phase two and the climax came off on Friday, June 25, 2021. The staff and students are expected to plant about 100 different tree species acquired from the Forestry Commission of Ghana.

> Addressing a gathering of staff and students, the Vice-Chancellor said that apart from championing the Green Ghana Agenda, the exercise was to instil in them the habit of preserving the environment through greening. He added that

they had already planted about 10 trees at the Kinbu campus and are dedicated to making the Mpehuasem campus green.

Mr. Malik Mino Ereira, a representative for the Waste Segregation and Composting Movement. commended the University for the foresight.

Madam Soni Valecha, a representative for Planet Waves, an organisation focused on preventing the earth from becoming one big landfill, encouraged the ATU to join the campaign for responsible waste management.

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Amevi Acakpovi, in a guided tour of the various furnished laboratories said "as you can see,

It has laboratories for Automotive Engineering, Welding and Fabrication, Electrical/Electronic Engineering, Interior Design, Upholstery Technology, and the Computerised Numerical Control Machine Centre.
