Outreach Committee, Science Laboratory Technology (SLT) Department Embark on Outreach, Donate Items Worth GH¢12,000.00

In a commendable effort to bolster educational opportunities for underprivileged second-cycle institutions in the Greater Accra Region, the Outreach Committee of Accra Technical University, in collaboration with the Science Laboratory Technology (SLT) Department, embarked on an education outreach and donation exercise on Friday, April 12, 2024. The initiative kicked off at the Teshie Technical Training Institute and concluded at Teshie St. John's Senior High School, both in the Ledzokuku Municipal District.



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The ATU team took students through career guidance and counselling, focusing on the Sciences. Students had the opportunity to experience chemistry, biochemistry, biology, and physics lab practices as SLT Department students conducted demonstrations.

Throughout the day-long endeavour, the team distributed a wide array of essential items valued at GH 12,000. Among the provisions were stationery, sanitary items like brushes, dustbins, gloves, tissue rolls, and other educational



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necessities. 

EMPOWERING FACULTY: ACCRA TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY PRIORITIZES PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN BLENDED LEARNING

The Directorate of Quality Assurance and Academic Planning, alongside Accra Technical University's management and faculty deans, recently conducted a three-day comprehensive training workshop for its teaching staff. Held from April 3 to April 5, 2024, at the university auditorium, the workshop aimed to equip the teaching staff with essential skills for navigating modern education, especially in blended learning.



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Covering various aspects of effective pedagogy tailored to the university's blended learning model, participants engaged in discussions and practical sessions focused on optimising teaching strategies for both physical and virtual classrooms. A notable highlight was the session on test and marking scheme development, where faculty members received guidance on designing assessments to accurately evaluate students' comprehension and mastery of course material while fostering critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

Throughout the workshop, faculty members had the opportunity to inquire about learning approaches and the use of modern technological tools for academic work, particularly AI tools for student assignments and innovative approaches to integrating artificial intelligence into academic tasks.



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Professor Eric Anane, an Associate Professor specialising in Measurement, Evaluation, and Cognition, urged lecturers to devise strategies for addressing students who utilise AI tools by emphasising practical assignments.

He emphasised the importance of providing students with hands-on practical work to deepen their understanding of the course material, stating, “by integrating practical assignments into our teaching approach, we can ensure students develop a deeper grasp of the subject matter, enhancing their learning experience.”



Dr. Henry Kwadwo Hackman, the Director of Quality Assurance and Academic Planning, emphasized the university’s commitment to providing high-quality education that meets the evolving needs of students in today’s digital age. “Our goal is to empower our teaching staff with the necessary tools and knowledge to deliver engaging and effective instruction, whether in traditional classroom settings or through online platforms,” he stated.

Additionally, the workshop emphasised the importance of developing comprehensive course outlines and teaching resources. Faculty members learned techniques for structuring course content clearly and organising teaching resources to cater to the varied learning styles of students.
